Job Description

Purpose

This post offers candidates comprehensive experience of academic medicine and will enable the post-holder to develop their own research or teaching programme through modules provided through the University while continuing clinical practice in East Lancashire.

Duties

- 2. Collaborate with academic colleagues and the development of research/educational activity.
- 3. Attend and contribute to group meetings.
- 4. Contribute to collaborative decision making with colleagues on academic content and on the assessment of student's work.
- 5. Share responsibility for deciding how to deliver teaching and assess students.
- 6. Supervise/teach undergraduate interns in relevant topics.
- 7. Undertake all duties in line with the University's Health and Safety Policy.
- 8. Show a commitment to diversity, equal opportunities, and anti-discriminatory practices.
- 9. Undertake other relevant duties and responsibilities appropriate to the grade of the post.

- Allied Health Professional (registered with the Health and Care Professions Council)
- Evidence of team working skills and the potential to be a leader (Application/Interview).
