Job Description

Purpose

This post offers candidates comprehensive experience of academic medicine and will enable the post-holder to develop their own research or teaching programme through modules provided through the University while continuing clinical practice in East Lancashire.

Duties

1. Undertake training in their area of interest in research or teaching depending on their current experience.
2. Collaborate with academic colleagues and the development of research/educational activity.
3. Attend and contribute to group meetings.
4. Contribute to collaborative decision making with colleagues on academic content and on the assessment of student's work.
5. Share responsibility for deciding how to deliver teaching and assess students.
6. Supervise/teach undergraduate interns in relevant topics.
7. Undertake all duties in line with the University's Health and Safety Policy.
8. Show a commitment to diversity, equal opportunities, and anti-discriminatory practices.
9. Undertake other relevant duties and responsibilities appropriate to the grade of the post.

- Nurse (registered with Nursing and Midwifery Council)
- Physician Associate (will be regulated by GMC by the end of 2026)
- Allied Health Professional (registered with the Health and Care Professions Council)
- Evidence of team working skills and the potential to be a leader (Application/Interview).
